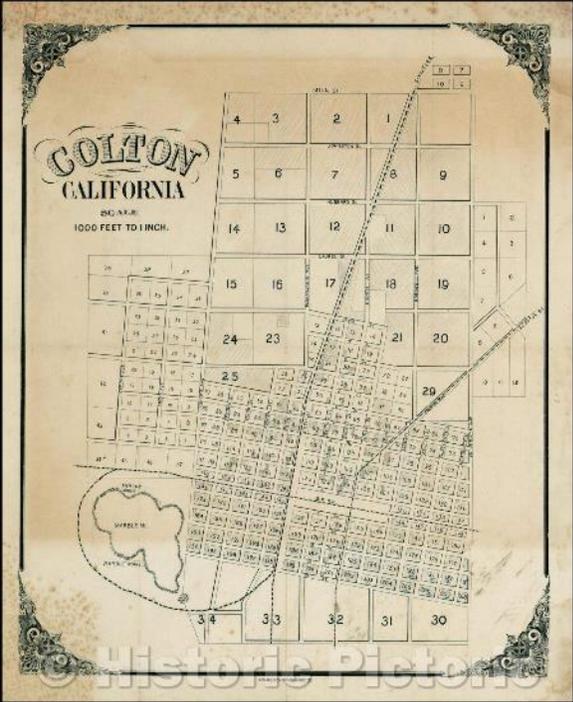

Q: Why Is the City Updating the Cultural Resources Element?

- Colton's Cultural Resources Element turned 22 years old this year!
 - Adopted in 2000
 - Time for an update to reflect current best professional practices
- Element updates give us the chance to make sure our Goals, Policies, and Action Items reflect **present-day** conditions, challenges, and issues





Q: What Is a “Cultural Resource”?

“Cultural Resource” = umbrella for three resource types

#1: Historical Resources

Buildings, Structures, Objects, Sites, Historic Districts, & Cultural Landscapes

#2: Archaeological Resources

Typically Objects, Sites, Historic Districts, and Cultural Landscapes

#3: Tribal Cultural Resources

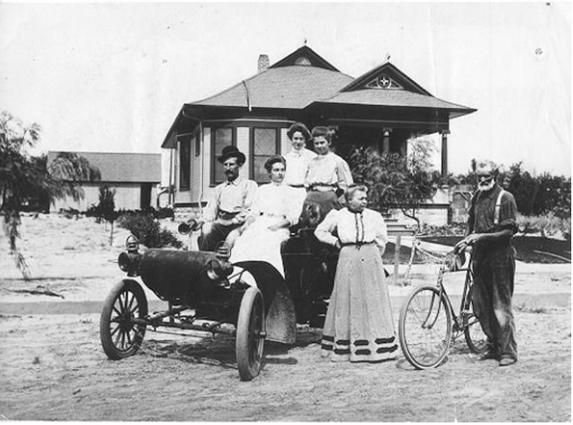
Tribal Cultural Properties and Landscapes



Q: What Is a Cultural Resource Element?

- A General Plan chapter
 - Not part of zoning code
 - Optional chapter in the General Plan
 - **But if included**, the Cultural Resources Element carries the same weight as other General Plan chapters
- An opportunity for the City and the community to establish priorities and set the course for the management of Cultural Resources
 - This can include Policies and Action Items revolving around Preservation Planning Initiatives, Policy Updates, and Community Partnerships

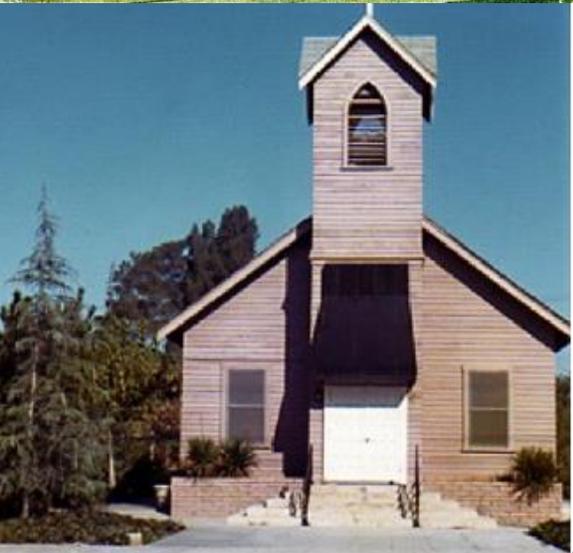

Goal #1: Identify Historical Resources

Policy #1:

Proactively identify Colton's significant historical resources

Policy #2:

Recognize resources reflecting all of Colton's historic eras (from founding years, through Mid-Century Modern era, and recent past)

Policy #3:

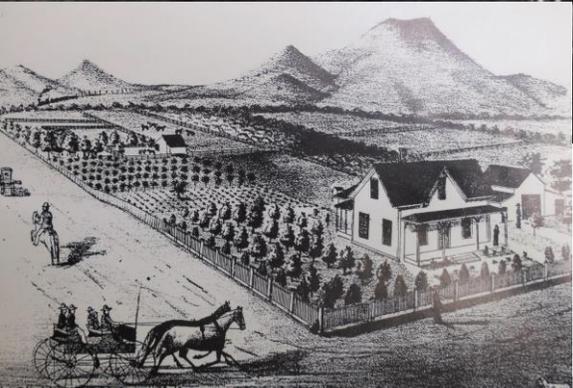
Ensure that historical resources survey and evaluations consider potential social-cultural importance as well as architectural style

Policy #4:

Expand designation for those resources presently under-represented on Register

Policy #5:

Encourage an innovative, inclusive preservation program





Goal #2: Document Historical Resources

Policy #1:

Foster appreciation and knowledge of Colton's history and cultural resources program among other City agencies and departments

Policy #2:

Create opportunities for research partnerships with schools, historical societies, local scholars, and the media

Policy #3:

Explore ways to honor and document the history of Colton's diverse communities

Policy #4:

Ensure that the City's Register of Landmarks and Inventory of Historical Resources are readily accessible and transparent to the public





Goal #3: Preserve & Protect Historical Resources

Policy #1:

Encourage retention of historical resources

Policy #2:

Expand and enhance preservation incentives

Policy #3:

Provide guidance to the public on how to sensitively upgrade and change historic properties

Policy #4:

Promote designation of historic districts and landmarks

Policy #5:

As a City, set an example for sound stewardship by retaining and protecting City-owned historical resources





Goal #4: Educate re: Historical Resources

Policy #1:

Facilitate broad public understanding of Colton's historic preservation program, best practices, policies, and zoning code



Policy #2:

Build public awareness of and appreciation for Colton's rich history and heritage, both sociocultural as well as architectural



Policy #3:

Leverage Colton's status as a Certified Local Government to expand public awareness of our historic preservation program and policies



Goal #5: Celebrate Historical Resources



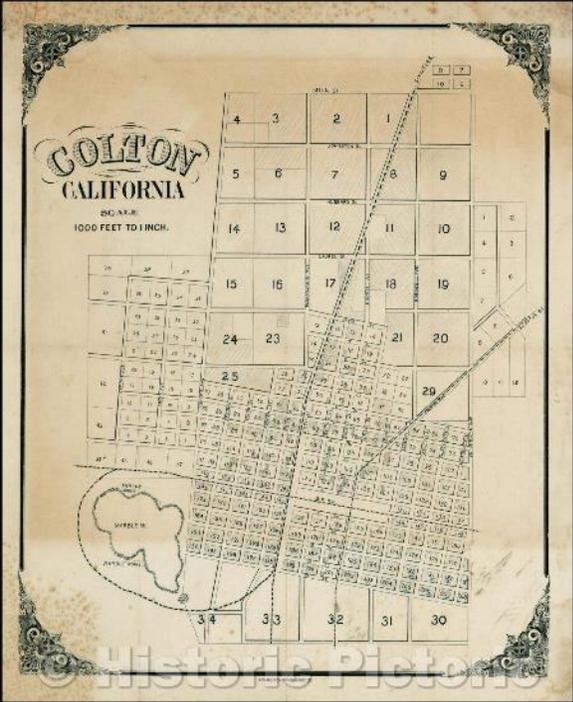

Update City-wide inventory of archaeological resources on a regular basis

Policy #2:

Engage in meaningful consultation with local Native American groups regarding tribal cultural resources





Goal #2: Document Archaeological Resources

Policy #1:

Ensure best-practice based documentation of significant archaeological resources

Policy #2:

Create opportunities for research partnerships with schools, scholars, and media



Goal #2: Document Tribal Cultural Resources

Policy #1:

Document significant tribal cultural resources in a culturally sensitive manner

Policy #2:

Create and maintain an archive of local Native American connections to the City and its environs





Goal #3: Preserve & Protect Archaeological Resources

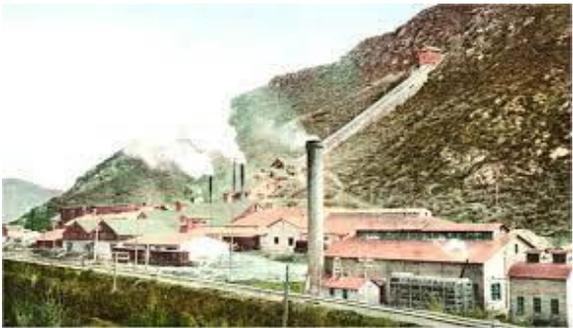
Policy #1:

Enhance public policy for the proactive protection of Colton's archaeological resources



Policy #2:

Ensure the conservation of significant archaeological resources



Goal #3: Preserve & Protect Tribal Cultural Resources



Policy #1:

Develop public policy for the proactive protection of Colton's tribal cultural resources

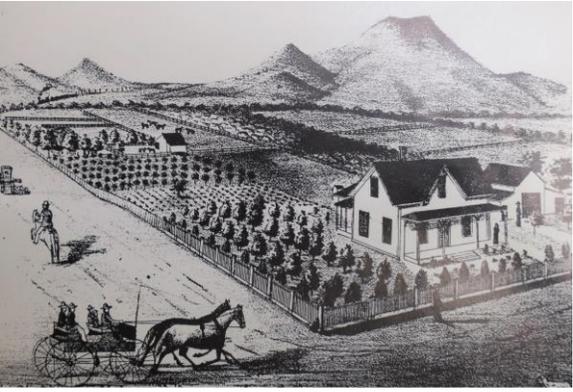
Policy #2:

Ensure the conservation of significant tribal cultural resources and other places significant to local Native American tribes



Policy #3:

Coordinate with local Native American tribes to provide stewardship, access and protection to tribal cultural resources in the City

Policy #2:

Raise public awareness of and appreciation for Colton's Native American heritage

Policy #2:

Identify ways to honor and reward successful preservation projects and stakeholder partnerships in Colton

Acknowledge and celebrate contributions of Native Americans to the community, past and present
