

Commercial Edible Food Generators



Senate Bill (SB) 1383 is designed to reduce food waste by requiring **Commercial Edible Food Generators (CEFGs)** to donate their extra food to registered food recovery organizations (FROs), such as food pantries.

Don't Feed the Landfill, Feed Those in Need!

Is your food business a CEFG? CEFGs are:

- Supermarkets/Grocery stores
- Food service providers
- Food distributors
- Wholesale food vendors
- Hotels (200+ rooms)
- Restaurants (over 5,000 sq. ft. or 250 seats)
- Health facilities (100+ beds)
- Large venues and events
- State agency cafeterias (over 5,000 sq. ft. or 250 seats)
- Local education agency and non-local entities


To comply with SB 1383 a CEFG must...

- ✓ Recover excess edible food
- ✓ Establish written agreements with your FRO
- ✓ Keep food donation records in pounds per month available on site
- ✓ Develop employee training on your Food Recovery Program

Environmental Health Services (EHS) inspects CEFGs to make sure they are in compliance.
