



# Community Meeting: Truck Routes

Assembly Bill 98 (AB 98, Reyes) passed on September 30, 2024 and Senate Bill 415 (SB 415, Reyes) passed on October 3, 2025 legislate warehouse development and truck routes. Key provisions of the law relevant to tonight's discussion are as follows:

1. Law requires General Plan to include a truck route map
2. Law requires a General Plan amendment for all future truck route changes
3. Law requires community engagement to designate truck route changes
4. Law requires avoidance of sensitive receptors to the extent feasible

City of Colton General Plan Mobility Element (2013) currently states the following:

*Truck routes will **continue to be defined by ordinance via the Municipal Code** and will require City Council approval for modification. Truck routes are subject to change based on vehicular traffic, changes to surrounding city truck routes, enforcement, and trucking demand through Colton. At a minimum, the following roadways will continue to serve as truck routes to support industrial business activity:*

*Valley Boulevard*

*Fairway Drive*

*Pepper Avenue*

*La Cadena Drive*

*Mount Vernon Avenue*

*Rancho Avenue (south of Valley)*

*Colton Avenue*

*Washington Street*
